SAFE PASSAGE: SCHOOL YEAR 2023-24

One of the safest places for young people to be is in school - that's why one of the priorities each school day is to ensure students are supported as they travel to and from school.

The District's Safe Passage, Safe Blocks program assigns Safe Passage Ambassadors – trained and trusted adults from community-based organizations - to select schools and works to build relationships with school staff, students, and families. Safe Passage programming includes conflict resolution, mediation services, and relationship building to keep students safe and improve student attendance.

HOW DOES SAFE PASSAGE WORK?

During School Year 2023-2024, 48 schools are covered by Safe Passage Ambassadors between student arrival (8 a.m.- 10 a.m.) and student dismissal (2:30 p.m.- 6 p.m.).


Approximately 180 Safe Passage Ambassadors are assigned to schools and surrounding neighborhoods.

Ambassadors serve as an additional set of "eyes and ears" on students' commutes and are trained to build positive, trusting relationships with students. They work to positively engage with students, families, businesses, civic associations, institutional facilities, and community members within the priority area(s) to identify, intervene, de-escalate, and report violence.

WHAT DISTRICT AGENCY MANAGES THE SAFE PASSAGE PROGRAM?

In October 2023, the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Public Safety and Justice (DMPSJ) assumed day-to-day management of the District's Safe Passage program. This school year, DMPSJ focused on establishing new protocols for Safe Passage Ambassadors to report unusual incidents along their routes and ensuring Ambassadors have necessary training. Safe Passage Ambassadors receive trainings in topics such as youth development, working with youth, reframing conflict, engaging with families, trauma informed care, and best practices of youth work.
